
Holt cinema - a Regal history


When The Regal cinema opened in Peacock Lane, it quickly supplanted the existing cinema in New Street which had opened a few years earlier. In *Wartime and Post-war Holt*, John Roebuck describes it as 'almost the eighth wonder of the world'.

As a young man, John Jarvis became assistant projectionist at The Regal and has since chronicled its rise and eventual demise, amassing a wealth of stories, images and memorabilia.

We are delighted that John has agreed to speak to The Holt Society on Wednesday February 20th at 7.00pm in The Britten Building, Gresham's School.

November saw the successful launch of the children's book *Escapades in Holt*. Based on an idea of Lindsay Furniss and produced by Susan Williams (Hon. Secretary) the book aims to bring local history to life in a way that appeals to both the young and not so young alike. Designed to encourage children, families and friends to discover the wonderful town of Holt through a series of interesting stories and local anecdotes, the tale guides readers artfully on a trail following the town mascot – Olly the Owl.

Story lines, brought to life in rhyme by Lynda Turbet, captivate and draw the reader in, whilst stylish and quirky illustrations by Andy Ward take a full cast of characters on a page-turning adventure. Read as they fly, walk or even charge, through the humorous storylines and weave their way in and out through recognisable buildings and street scenes of Holt.

Donations from our members have helped to keep the price low so that it is accessible to as many children as possible and a 'donation' scheme offering free books to local schools,
